


CURRICULUM FEEDBACK

Graph 1- On asked about the relevance of the unit in the syllabus the students rated the topic regarding how the unit is related to the course. They rated the course in five categories which are excellent, very good, good, average and poor. In its graphical representation the horizontal axis represents the percentage response and the vertical axis represents the feedback from the students. Out of a total number of 114 students 19.6% are of the opinion that the relevance of the unit in syllabus related to the course is excellent. 20.6% vote for very good and 36.9% the majority opted good. Less than a 20% which is 19.5% students said it is average and the remaining 1.5% students shared the opinion that the relevance is poor. While many shares an opinion regarding the question a percentage of 1.9% of students opted it as not applicable





Their ratings were turned in to a graph in which the horizontal line indicates the percentage response and the vertical line




students said the relevance of textbooks and the reference books to the course is average, the other 3.2% opted it as poor. The remaining 1.1% considered the question as not applicable one.











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






